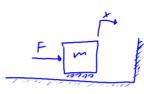
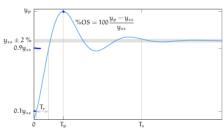
## trans.char Transient response characteristics

We define four transient response characteristics, all defined in terms of a system's step input response. For the following, please refer to the illustration in Fig. char.1.

- The rise time T<sub>r</sub> is the duration from the time the response reaches 10 % to the time it reaches 90 % of its final value.
- The peak time T<sub>p</sub> is the time at which the response reaches its first or maximum peak <sup>1</sup>
- The percent overshoot %OS expresses the amount the response overshoots its steady-state value, expressed as a percentage of the steady-state value.
- The settling time T<sub>s</sub> is the time at which the response reaches, and thereafter remains within, ±2 % of its steady-state value.<sup>1</sup>

1. This definition assumes the step input occurs at t=0. Otherwise, subtract the nonzero initial time.
